

Mrs. Humphrey services set 2/15/75

Mrs. Barbara Ann Humphrey, 80, the wife of Chester A. Humphrey of Newburg, died late Saturday evening, Feb. 15, at Grinnell General Hospital, following a lengthy illness.

The daughter of Porter Y. and Bertha Foster Fuller, she was born Nov. 12, 1894, east of Newburg. She attended rural schools near her home, as well as the Chester Center School.

She was graduated from Grinnell High School with the class of 1914 and attended Iowa State University for two years. On Feb. 28, 1917, she was married to Chester A. Humphrey at her family farm home. The couple had four children: Mrs. Waldo (Maxine) Paul of Grinnell, Mrs. Raymond (Marjory) Wallis of Cofax, Donald P. Humphrey of Newburg and Mrs. William (Dorothy) Wiseman of Gilman.

Mr. and Mrs. Humphrey had farmed in Chester Township in Poweshiek County and Hickory Grove Township in Jasper County. They had made their home on the present farm since 1923.
