

TRUMAN HUMPHREY

Funeral Services for Truman Humphrey, 65, of Oskaloosa, were held at 2 p.m., Tuesday, in the Nevenhoven Funeral Home, Brooklyn. Mr. Humphrey died Saturday, May 14, 1988, in the Veterans Medical Center, Des Moines.

Rev. Gerald M. Brown, pastor of the Trinity Lutheran Church of rural Malcom, officiated. The organist was Mrs. Sybil Kelley. Casket-bearers were Roland DeVilder, Daryl Goodlow, Harry Kilmer, Dave Lemke, Howard Walker, and Lester Beyer. Interment was in the Trinity Lutheran Church Cemetery, rural Malcom, with military rites conducted by members of Francis Gallagher American Legion Post #294.

Truman Walter Humphrey, son of Alva and Myrtle Schultz Humphrey, was born near Malcom, Iowa, on May 17, 1922. He graduated from the Brooklyn High School in 1942. He served with the US Army from Dec. 3, 1942, to January 13, 1946.

He was employed by Hubbard Lumber Yard and Fullerton Lumber Co. in Brooklyn and a lumber yard in Oskaloosa.

Mr. Humphrey was a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie #276 and VFW Post #2337, both of Oskaloosa.

Surviving are his two sons and their wives, David and Beverly Humphrey of Monroe, N.Y., and Larry and Krista Humphrey of Brooklyn; and four grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother.
