Mrs. Edith Hunting Services Saturday

The daughter of Sarah and Basil Alldredge, she was born in Decatur, Nebr., on Oct. 12, 1879.

When she was seven years old, her family moved to Sloan, Iowa, where she attended school. In her youth, she was baptized into the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints.

On April 26, 1897, she was united in marriage with John H. Hunting. To this union seven children were born. They made their home in Onawa and Grinnell before moving to Montezuma in 1904 where they lived until 1923. They also lived in Hartwick and Barnes City where Mr. Hunting managed lumber yards. They returned to Montezuma to live until 1961 when they went to the I.O.O.F. Home near Mason City to reside until Mr. Hunting's death in 1963. The last few years of her life were spent in a local nursing home.

Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by three children, Josephine, Harold and Newell.

She is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Gladys Morgan of Guernsey; three sons, William of San Bruno, Calif., Francis of Yakima, Wash., Dean of Santee, Calif.; 12 grandchildren; many great-grandchildren and several great-great-grandchildren; and three brothers and two sisters.
