MRS. E. O. HUNTING PASSES

Death Comes to Gifted Grinnell Graduate—Was Ema Suckow.

Friends are grieved to learn of the recent death of Mrs. E.O. Hunting of Denver, Colorado, at the Oaks Grove sanitorium. Mrs. Hunting had been in delicate health for some time, but it was believed that she was improving. Death came to her in her sleep, as it had come three years ago to her mother, Mrs. Anna M. Suckow, of beloved memory among Grinnell circles.

Ema Suckow, of the class of '08. was one of Grinnell's choicest and most highly talented graduates. Her sweet voice contributed to the wealth of musical life in Grinnell, and also delighted audiences in other towns. After graduation she taught music in the public schools in Minnesota and Iowa, and by her talent and charm as well as her faithful work won many warm friends among the parents of her little ones; and the public performances in which her pupils were presented won much favorable comment. a star the still

In addition to musical accomplishments she possessed exceptional literary ability. She wrote a considerable number of exquisite stories and poems, and was a member of the Denver Women's Press Club, an organization in which membership can be held only by women whose writings have been published. Her ambition and industry and very high aims, and the rare scholarship and insight revealed in her productions foretold a brilliant future.
