
DEATH FROM APOPLEXY

Body of Frank Hutchinson is Found
in Pasture of his Father's

HAD GONE THERE TO
LOOK AFTER SOME COLTS

Coroner Friend Decided that Death
was Due to Natural
Causes

The body of Frank Hutchinson was found lying beside a hedge fence in a pasture on his father's farm seven miles south of Brooklyn about 7 o'clock Friday evening. He was quite dead but the body was still warm when discovered. Hutchinson, who lived a mile north of Montezuma, had gone to his father's farm in the morning to look after some colts. Neighbors saw the car standing there all day and toward evening when it was still there they telephoned Mrs. Hutchinson and the search was instituted which led to the discovery of the body.

A pencil lying on the dead man's chest indicated that he had endeavored to write a last message but did not have strength to do so.

Coroner Friend was summoned but decided that death was due to natural causes, probably apoplexy, and that no inquest was necessary.

Hutchinson was 41 years old.
