

Minnie Hyatt rites Thursday

Minnie M. Hyatt, 84, of Kellogg died Monday, Nov. 14, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Kellogg, with the Rev. A.L. Schulz officiating. Organist was Esther Schulz, and vocalist was Dwight Lenz.

Graveside services were at 1:30 p.m. Thursday at Evergreen Cemetery, Collins.

The daughter of James W. and Atta Gorham Marsh, she was born Sept. 13, 1904, in Greer County, Okla. The family moved to Collins where she graduated from Collins High School in 1923. She also graduated from Ellsworth College in Iowa Falls.

She was an elementary school teacher in the Collins, Iowa Falls, Newburg and Kellogg schools.

She was married to Samuel T. Hyatt Aug. 25, 1937, at Collins. The couple farmed near Collins for 17 years, then moved to Kellogg. Mrs. Hyatt was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, the Women's Fellowship of the church, and state and national education associations.
