**Thursday Services For  
Mrs. Mary L. Icenbice**

Funeral services for Mrs. Mary L. Icenbice, 83, were held Thursday, Jan. 14, at the Montezuma Methodist Church with the Rev. Frank E. Jacobs in charge. Soloist at the church was Mrs. Vincent Johnson accompanied by organist, Miss Alice Underwood.
