

Funeral Services Held For Rev. Frank Jacobs, Methodist Pastor

The funeral service for a prominent Montezuma Church leader, the Rev. Mr. Frank E. Jacobs, pastor of the Montezuma Methodist Church, was held Monday morning, Nov. 22, at the church. Officiating at the service were Dr. Lloyd Latta, Dr. Arthur Keast, the Rev. Mr. Lester Hall and the Rev. Mr. Harold Butts.

Music was provided by the Chancel Choir with Miss Alice Underwood as organist. The ushers were Tom Erickson, Robert Simpson, Ralph Peters, Frank Wheeler and Phil Evans.

The casket bearers were Carmon Johnson, Everett Johnson, Vincent Johnson, Harold Bryan, Loel Ferguson and R.J.H. Badger. Interment was at Grant City, Mo.

Frank Edwin, son of David Edwin and Myrtle Wolfe Jacobs, was born in Worth County, Mo., on Feb. 5, 1904 and died in a Des Moines hospital Friday, Nov. 19. The Rev. Jacobs had been taken to the hospital the previous evening after having an apparent heart attack at his home. He was 61 years old.

He graduated from high school at Grant City, Mo., in 1923. After completing high school taught school two years before entering college. He received his BA degree from Central College at Fayette, Mo., in 1929. In 1931 he received his Bachelor of Divinity degree from Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Tex.

He was united in marriage with Verne Arnold on June 5, 1929 at Fayette, Mo.

During his years in college he served student appointments in Missouri and Texas. He served churches in St. Joseph, Keytesville and Albany, Mo., before coming to the Iowa Conference. In Iowa his pastorates included three years in Randolph, three in Osceola, six in Greenfield, five in Corning and six in Fort Des Moines. He has been pastor of the Montezuma church since 1962.

He was preceded in death by his parents and an infant brother.
