Bill Jahlas Buried 3 At St John's Mar. 31

Wilhelm Heinrich Johann Jahlas was born on Aug. 27, 1889 at Glaisin, Mecklenburg - Schwerin, Germany. His parents were Johann and Dorothea Schlichting Jahlas. He was baptized on Sept. 8, 1889 in the Lutheran church in Germany, and came to the United States in 1895.

He received his religious instruction from the Rev. Otto Kitzmann of St. John's Lutheran and was confirmed July 31, 1904.

He was united in marriage with Anna Burke on Feb. 20, 1917. To this union seven children were born.

Mr. Jahlas had been in failing health for some time, and died at Grinnell March 27, 1969.

Surviving are his wife, Maria, four sons and three daughters: Harold of Detroit, Mich.; Raymond of Deep River; William of Deep River; Laverne of Victor; Mrs. Arnold (Marie) Trimpe of Williamsburg; Mrs. Paul (Mildred) Trimpe of Williamsburg; Mrs. Alfred (Esther) Trimpe of Homestead. Also 25 grandchildren, six great grandchildren, two sisters, Mrs. Will (Frieda) Cordes and Mrs. Arthur (Martha) Koehn.
