Mrs. Julia F. Jamieson.

Mrs. Julia F. Jamieson was born at Madura, India, in 1837 and passed away in Grinnell Thursday, Jan. 18, 1917. Her parents, Rev. and Mrs. N. M. Crane, had gone to India as missionaries. After eight years' service they returned to America, locating in New Jersey. They afterwards moved to western Pennsylvania, and Illinois, and later to Indiantown, Tama county, Iowa, where Mr. Crane died. In 1859 Mrs. Crane moved to Grinnell, buying and occupying the site where her daughter, Mrs. Jamieson, died. After marriage and a residence elsewhere, Mrs. Jamieson returned in 1868 with her two sons, Marc and Charles, to Grinnell, and here she has since lived, a period of 48 years. The two boys graduated from college and then went to Warren, Pa., where both prospered in business. The younger, C. W., died in 1912.

Both sons always held Grinnell in high regard and made visits here to be a short time with their mother and renew their love for the old home. Mrs. Jamieson lived in Grinnell the quiet, lovely life of a woman of high and cultured ideals and, with her sister, Miss Emily Crane, whose home was with her, retained the love of all her old friends.

Her son, M. W. Jamieson, with his wife, both of whom were graduates of the college, came to be present at the funeral and are remaining a few days.

The funeral was held at the house Saturday at 2:20 o'clock, conducted by Rev. E. W. Cross, pastor of the Congregational church, of which the deceased had been a member nearly all of her forty-eight years of continued residence here.

Interment was in the family lot in Hazelwood.

Two nieces, Dr. Gertrude Crane of Nebraska City, Neb., and Dr. Jessie Crane of Norfolk, Neb., came to attend the funeral.
