

Allen Jantzen rites Friday

Allen H. Jantzen, 36, of 604 Washington Ave. died of carbon monoxide poisoning sometime Saturday, Sept. 10.

His body was found early Monday afternoon on the floor of the garage at the home.

Funeral services for Mr. Jantzen will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John Epperson of the Grinnell Christian Church officiating. Burial will be at the Sheridan Cemetery northeast of Grinnell.

Visitation will be from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. this evening at the funeral home, where friends may call.

The son of Harold L. and Betty Jean Emmert Jantzen, he was born July 9, 1947, in Grinnell. He attended rural school near the family farm and graduated from Tama High

School in 1965. He served with the U.S. Air Force during the Vietnam conflict, then attended Upper Iowa University, graduating in 1970 with a bachelor's degree in business.

He was married to Nancy L. Graham on Nov. 29, 1971, at Malcom. The couple lived in Grinnell, where he was employed by General Telephone Co. At the time of his death, he was service coordinator in the company's reports section. He was a member of the Tama Eagles Lodge.

Mr. Jantzen is survived by his wife; his parents of rural Malcom; a brother, Jerry Jantzen of Malcom; his paternal grandfather, Leonard Jantzen of Tama; and his maternal grandmother, Frances Emmert of Grinnell.
