For over 40 years a barber in Grinnell, Edward H. Jantzen, 62, of 909½ Main street, died at 10 p. m. Tuesday in Veterans hospital, Des Moines, after an illness of five months. He had been hospitalized since March 15.

Edward Herman Jantzen, son of John Jantzen and Wilomina Minnie Dieterich, was born in Sheridan township. Poweshiek county, Aug. 2, 1892. He was married at Grinnell on Feb. 29, 1928 to Helen Knapp. He is survived by his wife and a sister, Mrs. Ed Septh of Grinnell.

Jantzen was a resident of Grinnell 50 years and barbered here for more than four decades. At the time of his recent illness his shop was located next to the Model cafe on Main street.

A veteran of World War I. Jantzen was a member of the American Legion and served the local post as commander following the second war. He also was a member of the 40 & 8, the IOOF and the Elks.
