October 16. 1862, she was united in marriage with Bartholomew Jenkins, a young farmer who had settled in the township in 1854, and together they started housekeeping in a liftle log cabin just a short distance southeast of where the G. & M. Junction now is. The log house was originally built near Forest Home, and brought to his farm by Mr. Jenkins, and here they lived several years, as Mrs. Jonkins afterwards remarked, the happiest years of their life. Afterwards, through care, work and economy, they accumulated more land and built a new home, living 28
