Gladys Warburton Jensen, 84, of Grinnell died Monday, May 14, at the Baldwin Community Memorial Hospital in Baldwin, Wis. Mrs. Jensen had been in Baldwin visiting her son, Carl.

A memorial service will be conducted at 2 p.m. Saturday in Dennison Chapel of the Mayflower Home here, with the Rev. David Bowman officiating. Pianist will be Norman Goodbrod, and soloist will be Ed Poush. The Murphy-Troyer Funeral Home of Baldwin is in charge of arrangements.

The body was cremated at Forest Lawn Crematory in Maplewood, Minn. Burial of the ashes will be at a later date in Pilot Rock Cemetery, Cherokee County.

The daughter of James and Rosanna Jenness Warburton, she was born Dec. 15, 1905, in Cherokee County. She graduated from Cherokee High School in 1921.

She was married to Lawrence A. Jensen in 1923 in Cherokee, and the couple lived in Waterloo from 1923 to 1944. Mr. Jensen died in 1956. Following the death of her husband, Mrs. Jensen attended business school, graduating from Gates Business College in Waterloo in 1957.

From the fall of 1958 until retiring in 1970, Mrs. Jensen lived in Turkey and worked as an executive secretary for the United Church of Christ Missionaries. After retiring, she moved to Grinnell and lived at the Mayflower Home.

Surviving are two sons, Donald of Columbia, S.C., and Carl of Baldwin; one sister, Winifred Hantsbarger of Cherokee; six grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; a son, James, in 1975; and one sister, Velma Warburton.
