H.R. Obituary Of 6-28-66
Ellen Marie Johnson

Ellen Marie Johnson, daughter of Ross and Lillie Moore, was born on a farm in Poweshiek county on October 25, 1906, and departed this life on June 28, 1966, having reached the age of 59 years, 9 months, and 3 days.

She was united in marriage to Leonard M. Johnson on Nov. 1, 1922. With the exception of 3 years in San Diego, Calif., during World War II, they have made the New Sharon community their home since their marriage.

Mrs. Johnson was captized into slavery in January, 1943, and has remained faithful since that time.

She is survived by her husband, Leonard M. Johnson; two children, Keith M. Johnson of Des Moines, Iowa, and Max Laverne Johnson of St. Louis, Mo.; two brothers, Max Moore of New Sharon and Roscoe Moore of Cedar Rapids, Iowa; 10 grandchildren; 2 great grandchildren; and a host of other relatives and friends.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Ross and Lillie Moore; one brother, Johnnie and a son, George, who gave his life during World War II.

Funeral rites were held Thursday, June 30, at the Harden Funeral Home with Robert H. Boaz conducting the service.
