He was a past president of the Grinnell Rotary Club and a past district governor of Rotary. He was also a member of the Masonic Lodge, the Za-Ga-Zig Shrine and the Elks Lodge and had served as drive chairman for the Grinnell United Way.

Surviviors include his wife; one daughter, Janet Schmidt of Grinnell; three grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; one son, Donald L., who was killed in action in World War II; five brothers and one sister.
