Cliff Jones Dies Tuesday Evening

Clifford Jones, longtime Herald-Register member, died Tuesday evening at Grinnell General East, after brief hospitalization.

He had been in failing health during recent weeks, but had been at his station in the mechanical department of the newspaper most of the time until this week.

Clifford Jones was the son of Benjamin and Dorothea Carsten Jones and was born in Grinnell on April 11, 1907. He attended the Grinnell schools and graduated from Grinnell high school. Following his graduation he was employed as a skilled bookbinder and pressman at the Grinnell Herald-Register for 42 years.

He was married to Mary Ann Kline in Grinnell on December 24, 1929. To this marriage were born two daughters—Mrs. Richard (Margaret Ann) Stoaks of Golden, Colo., and Mrs. Donald (Louise Arlene) Barnett of Omaha, Neb.

"Dutch", as he was known to all of his friends, had made his home in Grinnell all of his life, and had been a member of the Elks Lodge

in Grinnell when in better health.

He was also a member of the United Methodist church. He is survived by his wife Ava, his two daughters, and four grandchildren—Tony, Louann, Beth and Scott Stoaks, all of Golden, Colo. Also surviving are two sisters and one brother—Mrs. Charlie (Florence) Kaisand, Mrs. Orville (Helen) Pedersen, and Harold Jones, all of Grinnell. He is also survived by several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers and one sister—Mrs. Hilda Bruce and William Charles, Earnest, and Carl Jones.

Funeral services will be held at 1:00 p.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home with Pastor J. Eugene Young, minister of the Grinnell United Methodist church, officiating. Music will be provided by Mrs. William Heffner, organist, and Mrs. Norma Taylor, vocalist. Pallbearers will be Donald Barnett, Roscoe Hallam, A. J. Pinder, Richard Stoaks, Tony Stoaks and Max Thompson. Burial will be in Hazelwood cemetery.

The office and mechanical shop of The Herald-Register will be closed from 12 noon Friday until 2 o'clock.
