Prof. Richard Jones, died suddenly of heart failure on Monday at Rosebud, Alberta. He was a graduate of Grinnell College, a member of the class of 1879. He married Carrie Grinnell, daughter of the founder of the town and the college. and leaves six grown sons and uaughters. One son is a professor of chemistry in Harvard university, a second in professor of forestry in the University of Virginia, and a third is professor of economics in Stanford university, Professor Jones wsa an early principal of the west side high school of Des Moines, and later served as professor of liferature at Swarthmore, Syracuse, Vanderbift and Tufts college. He lived for many years at Cambridge, Mass. He was born in Wisconsin sixtyeight years ago.

Mr. Jones was formerly principal of the West High School of Des Moines, going to that school from the Guthrie County High School. The Rawson and Coggeshall boys graduated under Mr. Jones and he is largely responsible for their coming to Grinnell. Later he served as professor of literature at Swarthmore, Syracuse, Vanderbilt and Tufts College. He has lived for many years at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Mr. Jones visited in Grinnell the last time only a few months ago and the few of the Grinnell people who had the privilege of meeting him enjoyed his delightful company. He was a man of fine attainments and with his noble wife had raised their family until they are now filling positions of influence. He was one of the best known and best liked of the graduates of the earlier days.
