

L. P. Jordan's Mother Dies Near Deep River

Emily Jane Bell was born February 14, 1846, in Noble county, Ohio, and departed this life at her home east of Deep River April 13, 1926, lacking one day of being 80 years and two months old. The funeral took place from Dayton chapel, conducted by Rev. Cole of Ladora.
