

✓ KASSON, Rev. J. H. d. Nov. 27, 1872 at his residence in Grinnell, aged 55. His wife was Mary Robbins of Onanaga Co. N. Y. Leaves his widow and 3 sons. Ob

KASSON, Mary Robbins b. Norfolk, Conn. July 25, 1818 m. 1846 Rev. James H. Kasson and they went as missionaries to the wilds of Wis. and when his health failed came to Delaware Co., Ia. and in 1865 to Grinnell. He d. in 1872. She was a direct descendant of Gov. Bradford and her grandfather Robbins served 7 years in the Revolution. Her father's brother, Francis Robbins, was one of the 7 Williams College young men who held the famous "haystack prayer meeting" at which was organized the A.B.C.F.M. and in memory of which was erected the "Haystack Monument" in 1806. KASSON, Joseph Robbins d. Dec. 5, 1889. He was b. in Marquette Co., Wis. Aug. 7, 1849 and came to Ia. with his parents in 1855, first in Delaware Co., then to Grinnell. Here the father, Rev. Jas. H. Kasson d. in 1872 leaving Joseph, his eldest son, as head of the family. In 1886 he married Alice Pierce. Ob
