She met Mr. Keeton when she was staying at the home of her sister in O'Brien county and they were married near Grinnell Feb. 20, 1895. She united with Liberty thurch in July, 1915, and was baptized by her husband She has been an influence of sweetness and light in her home and among the people of her husband's congregation and will be greatly missed in the circles where for so long she has been honored and loved.
