

Carl J. Kelsey Dies in San Diego, Calif.

We sincerely regret the sudden death of Carl J. Kelsey on February 7, 1939, due to a heart attack.

A native of Grinnell, Iowa, Mr. Kelsey had resided in San Diego, twenty-seven years. For thirty-five years he had been an employee of the Santa Fe, holding the position of claim clerk at the time of his death.

Services were held February 11 in the Bradley-Woolman chapel under the auspices of Silver Gate Masonic lodge, of which Mr. Kelsey was a member. He was also a member of the Scouts.

He is survived by his widow, daughters Marion K. Patterson, Leona K. Shaw, and one son, Percy D. Kelsey, all of Los Angeles; Hazel K. Tompkins of San Diego; five sisters, Grace and Isabelle Kelsey, Katherine K. Gale and Mary K. Murphy of Los Angeles, Lucy K. Gates of Portland, Oregon, and two brothers, J. D. Kelsey of Chatsworth, Calif. and Frank L. Kelsey of Kansas City, Mo. and a number of nieces and nephews.

Carl was born in Grinnell, Iowa, May 21, 1879. His parents went to Grinnell in 1857 from New York. They moved to Des Moines in 1881 and to Los Angeles in 1905.
