In their Vermont home two of their children were born to them. In 1856 they came westward, locating near Colfax on a farm. Later they moved to Newton, where they lived until 1870. At that time they removed to Grinnell, where they have since lived, respected by all. Mr. Kendall has been sick for about a year, his trouble being heart disease, brought on from the effects of la grippe two years ago. For two months he has been unable to lie down. Mr. Kendall has seen nine children grow up to lives of usefulness and honor, one daughter and eight sons. In music the Kendall family have always been leaders in Grinnell. Mr. Kendall always took great pride in his family and it has always been an especial pleasure to him to see them live lives of usefulness in the community in which he had made his home. The funeral is held this afternoon at two o'clock, at the late residence of the deceased, north-west city, conducted by Rev. E. M. Vittum. The nine children are all living and present at the funeral, six of whom act as bearers this afternoon. Grinnell loses in the death of Mr. Kendall, one of its most respected citizens, a man of upright character, of the highest integrity and truest worth. A brother, Albert Kendall, of Sully, is present to attend the funeral.
