

HENRY H. KENNEDY

DIED ON SATURDAY

Sept 12, 1925

There are still many friends living in Grinnell who regret to learn of the death of Henry H. Kennedy at his home in Winetka, Ill., Saturday afternoon at 6:00.

Mr. Kennedy has been in poor health for two or three years, but part of the time has been attending to his legal work with offices in the Masonic Temple in Chicago. His death was due to cerebral hemorrhage. Funeral services were held at his home this afternoon. The remains will be accompanied to Grinnell by his wife and son. Burial will be in Hazelwood tomorrow at 10:30.

Mr. Kennedy was a graduate of Grinnell high school and also of Grinnell college in 1883. He was a young man of absolute integrity of character and a great reader. For a short time after graduation he served as local reporter for the Grinnell Herald, afterwards going to Ann Arbor where he graduated in law at Michigan University.

By pure force of character, hard work and legal ability he became a member of one of the leading corporation law firms of Chicago and has enjoyed a large practice and the confidence of all his friends.

He leaves a wife, Minnie Perkins Kennedy, and one son who is a graduate of Princeton college.

Few men have lived and been known in Grinnell who have established a better reputation for real legal ability and for high Christian character, and in the death of Mr. Kennedy, Chicago loses a real man and Grinnell a real friend.
