Montezuma boy stakes own life

Jimmy Kercheval, 14, of Montezuma, son of John and Sarah Kercheval, died Sunday at Grinnell General Hospital of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

The youth apparently shot himself in the head with a 22-caliber pistol his father had

kept hidden in a closet.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the Montezuma Christian Church, with burial in the Jackson Township Cemetery.

Jimmy Kercheval is survived by his parents; two sisters, Debra and Polly, and three brothers, Nicky, Alexander and David.

His parents were quoted Monday as saying that their son had been upset about being grounded and not being able to see his girlfriend.
