8-22 W. H. KEYES 1905

Wm. H. Keyes was born in the state of New York on Nov 5, 1848, and passed away at his home south of this city on the 13th of August 1905, so was nearly 57 years old. He was married at Ogdensburg, N. Y., to Miss Beulah Adams in 1868. To this union were born six children—three boys and three girls. One child—a daughter—preceded the father in death, the wife and other children remaining to mourn the loss of a kind husband and loving father.

The funeral services which were attended by a large number of friends of the deceased, were held from the home last Tuesday afternoon at half past two o'clock and were conducted by the Rev. J. M. McClelland. Beautiful music was furnished by a quartette composed of Mrs. A. D. Woodruff, Mrs. F. F. Case, Mr. C. W. Benson and Mr. C. L. Gardner. The pall bearers were Messrs. L. P.
