Earl E. Kibbee, 50, of 1518 Sixth Ave., Grinnell, was dead on arrival at Grinnell General Hospital early Monday after having suffered an apparent heart attack at his home.

Funeral services for Mr. Kibbee will be held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the First United Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. Daniel Ogata officiating. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery.

Mr. Kibbee was a veteran of World War II and the Korean conflict. He was employed by Miracle Recreation Co. here.
