

Friday crash kills 2

Two persons were killed and three others injured Friday afternoon in a two-car crash on foggy U.S. Highway 6 near Brooklyn.

Dead are Jimmie Lee Kibbee, 20, and his 17-year-old wife Mary Elizabeth, both of Brooklyn, who were passengers in a car driven by Donald Patton, 20, also of Brooklyn.

State Trooper Gerald Kahler of Grinnell said the Patton car, which was eastbound on Highway 6, was attempting to pass another vehicle when it slammed into a westbound car driven by J. A. Jermier of Brooklyn. The Patton car crashed into a ditch, and the Brooklyn Fire Department had to be called to remove the car's occupants from the wreckage.

Dies En Route

Mary Elizabeth Kibbee died

en route to Grinnell General Hospital, and Kibbee himself died before he could be transferred to University Hospitals in Iowa City.

Injured was the Kibbees' 31-month-old daughter Sheri, who was listed in fair condition at Grinnell General Hospital. Patton was also listed in fair condition Saturday at University Hospitals, Jermier,

a Brooklyn veterinarian, suffered only minor injuries.

Kahler, who investigated the accident along with the Poweshiek County Sheriff's Department, said charges are pending in the case.

Funeral services for Mr. and Mrs. Kibbee are pending at the Smith Funeral Home in Grinnell.
