Brooklyn Youth Dies in Mishap

A 16-year-old Brooklyn youth was killed Monday evening in a one-car mishap on a gravel road southeast of Brooklyn.

According to State Trooper Judd Kahler, who investigated the accident with Trooper Jerry Jones and Poweshiek County Deputy Sheriff John Griffin, Carl Kilmer of Rte. 1, Brooklyn, was pronounced dead at the scene by Poweshiek County Medical Examiner Dr. Kenneth Caldwell. The mishap occurred at 6 p.m.

Kahler said Kilmer's car was northbound on the gravel road, topped a hill, and swerved to avoid an approaching truck. The car went out of control, crashed into a ditch, rolled several times, went through a fence, and struck a tree. Kilmer was thrown from the car and died of multiple injuries.
