## Donald Kimm Is Killed in Accident

Donald D. Kimm, son of Albert and Irene Kimm, was born near Vinton, Iowa, Mar. 30, 1936. He received his education in the Guernsey school and graduated with the class of 1954. The family moved to the Guernsey community in 1941. He served in the armed forces for six months in the reserves at Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo., and Ft. Smith, Ark.

He was baptized in the Methodist faith and was a member of the Methodist church at Guernsey, after moving to that community. A short time before his marriage, he was baptized in the Catholic faith.

He was united in marriage to Rita Linnenkamp of Harper, Oct. 8, 1958, and to this union two sons were born. He had been engaged in farming northeast of Guernsey since his release from the armed services, and had also been working at the Crawford quarry northwest of Cedar Rapids for the past 10 months. That is where death occurred in an accident Thursday morning, Jan. 19. He had reached the age of 24 years, 9 months and 19 days.

Donald was a kind and loving husband and father, a good son and a friend and neighbor to everyone. He will be greatly missed by his family and all who knew him.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his wife; two sons, Douglas and Gary; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Kimm, Guernsey; two brothers, Vernon, Des Moines and Robert at home, and a sister, Karen, Cedar Rapids; three grandparents; other relatives and many friends.

Funeral services were held from St. Bridget church in Victor at 9:30 a.m. Monday, Jan. 23, with the Rev. J.W. McEleney officiating.
