What Cheer. The couple had six children. Mr. and Mrs. King had lived in What Cheer and Oskaloosa before moving to Grinnell in 1935. While in Grinnell they owned and operated King's Laundry for several years. In 1964 they moved to Malcom and operated King's Antique Shop.

Survivors include her husband, Cecil; four children, Donald D. King of Grinnell, Jack L. King of Livermore, Calif., U.S. Navy Cmdr. Larry N. King of Alexandria, Va., and Mrs. Louis (Kathleen) White of Grayslake, Ill.; 13 grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; and two brothers, William E. Colbert of Delta and Kenneth K. Colbert of Oskaloosa. She was preceded in death by her parents; two sons, Kenneth G. King in 1934 and Wayne A.
