William King Passes Away

Friday a short notice appeared in The Herald of the death of Frank King at Los Angeles, May 29. His daughter, Mrs. Marie McCoy, has written a personal letter to The Herald in which she speaks of her father's death. Her father and mother were listening to the radio a little after nine rclock of the 22nd of May. He suddenly slipped out of the chair and her mother called her into the room and a physician was called at once. The physician pronounced the trouble Cerebral Hemmorrhage of the right side of the head which caused paralysis of that entire side of the body. He was removed to a hospital where he died one week later.

W. F. King was born at Marietta, Ohio, May 17, 1861, and died May 29, 1933, at Los Angeles. The family removed to Saline county, Nebraska, where he grew to manhood. He was married at Lexington, Nebr., to Lucy Gertrude Barnes. In 1892 Mr. and Mrs. King moved to Grinnell and lived here until they moved to California in 1929. He had been in perfect health until the stroke which took him away.

He leaves to mourn his death his wife and his children, Josephine, Mrs. Arvee King-Gross, Obadiah F. Mrs. Marie King-McCoy, all of Los Angeles; J. F. King of Humbolt, W. Forrest King of Cedar Rapids and Clyde M. King of New Hampton, and five grandchildren.

Services were held in Los Angeles and the ashes reached Grinnell Monday, June 5, and were interred in the family lot in Hazelwood.
