Mary Emma Kingsley, 60, of Grinnell died Thursday afternoon (June 21) at St. Francis Manor. She had been in failing health for the past three years. 6-21-1973

The daughter of Samuel J. and Nellie Goudie Kingsley, she was born June 21, 1913, in Bedford, Iowa. She attended the Bedford public schools and made her home with her family in Bedford until 1926 when they moved to Colorado. In 1943, they moved to the West Coast, then came to Grinnell in 1952. Miss Kingsley was a member of the First Baptist Church.

Survivors include her mother; a brother, the Rev. Carl E. Kingsley of Norristown, Pa.; three sisters, Mrs. Everett (Mildred) Ilk of Denver, Colo., Mrs. James (Nellie) McPherson of Moab, Utah, and Mrs. Monte (Pearl) Payne of Hoquiam, Wash.; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins. She was preceded in death by her father, Samuel, who died May 2, 1966, and a sister, Ruth, who died in 1909.

Funeral services for Miss Kingsley were held at 11 a.m. today (Monday) at the Grinnell First Baptist Church, with the Rev. Hugh A. Shiveley officiating. Music was provided by Edward H. Bohstedt, organist, and Mrs. Donovan Evans and Mrs. LaForest Sherman, vocalists. Pallbearers were Ross Barber, Harold Brown, Donovan Evans, Maynard Raffety, Clair Strand, and Williard Wells. Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery, with the Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
