Mrs. R. Kinsey Dies Saturday; Rites Tuesday

Mrs. Alice Kinsey, 72, the wife of Robert S. Kinsey of 1333 Park Street, Grinnell passed away Saturday evening at Iowa Methodist hospital, Des Moines, following failing health of several years.

Funeral services for Mrs. Kinsey will be held at 1:00 p.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Ralph Beebe, officiating.

Carl Child, Charles Manly, Fred Wolfe, Max Smith, Raymond Schilders and Charles Kaufman will serve as pallbearers. Norman Goodbrod will be organist.

Burial will be in Greene county, near Jefferson, later Tuesday.

She was the daughter of James and Isabelle Love Nunn, and was born June 7, 1891, in Madison County, Iowa. Her family later moved to Jefferson, and she graduated from Jefferson high school.

On March 24, 1917, at Omaha, she was united in marriage to Robert S. Kinsey and to this union was born one son—Robert S. Kinsey Jr., now of Mason City.

Mrs. Kinsey had lived in Jefferson most of her young life, and following her marriage she lived in Perry. In 1930, Mr. and Mrs. Kinsey moved to Grinnell to make their home.

In addition to her husband and son, she is survived by three grandchildren: Robert S. Kinsey III of Grinnell College, and Ben Richard Kinsey and William Lazard Kinsey, both of Mason City, as well as two brothers and three sisters—Paul S. Nunn of Bellevue, Washington; Lloyd Nunn of Estherville; Mrs. Robert G. Jamieson of Phoenix, Arizona; Mrs. Lee Lones of Perry; and Mrs. C. C. Kohl of Tacoma, Washington.

She is also survived by several nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Mrs. Kinsey was preceded in death by her parents and two brothers: Earl and George.

Mrs. Kinsey was a member of the Grinnell Congregational church and was a member of Chapter B. M. of the P. E. O. Sisterhood. She was also a member of the Priscilla Club, the Levart Club, and the Eastern Star.
