

Former Barnes City Resident, C.C. Kirby, Rites In Idaho

Cedric Charles Kirby, 47, American Falls, Idaho, died at the Veterans' Hospital in Salt Lake City Thursday, Feb. 8, following an extended illness.

He was born July 23, 1920, in Tilton, Iowa, a son of Fred and Maude Bogard Kirby. He attended school in Barnes City, Iowa, and served in the U.S. Army Engineers from July, 1942 until November, 1945. He served overseas a year in France, Germany and Belgium.

He married Anna Mae Wagner in Lancaster, Mo., June 26, 1942. They moved to American Falls, Idaho, about 11 years ago where Mr. Kirby was manager of Reids Ready-Mix concrete plant and was more recently employed as foreman in the irrigation department of Power County Implement in American Falls.
