When they could not go to church they inquired very diligently about the church and how it was progressing. Mrs. Kirkland was a great reader, and loved the church paper which she took for several years. For over 60 years she had been a member of the church, and worked for its progress. There need be no worry about the future, for she loved her Master deeply.

There are three sisters and four brothers living. The sisters are Mrs. Lucinda McFadden of Grinnell, Mrs. Robert Rowe of Iowa City, and Mrs. William Donnan of Tintah, Minn. The four brothers are V.
