During World War II, he was awarded a Bronze Star and served with the U.S. Army in the European Theater as an operations officer in a field artillery battalion.

He was married to Barbara Howard May 30, 1942. They lived and traveled throughout Europe. He received a Docteur es Lettres degree from the University of Geneva in Switzerland.

In 1948, he became an assistant professor of French at Grinnell College, and in 1960 he was named professor of French. Mr. Kleinschmidt was awarded several academic prizes and fellowships, and

He spent summer months near Parry Sound, Ontario, Canada. His avocation was the history of Grinnell, and he was knowledgeable about its early citizens and buildings. He was a member of the Des Moines Club, Phi Beta Kappa and the Fortnightly Club of Grinnell.

He is survived by his wife. His parents preceded him in death.
