In 1942, he entered the Army and served in Belgium, France and Germany. He was discharged in 1945 and returned to farming. On April 25, 1951, he married Dorothy DeLoof at Brooklyn.

The couple farmed four miles north of Brooklyn for three years before moving to the Victor area, where they farmed until December of 1974. At that time they moved into Hartwick.
