Harriet Korns Services Held

Miss Harriet E. Korns, 88, died Monday morning, Sept. 18, at the Mayflower Home Health Center. She had been in failing health the past two months.

The daughter of Jacob C. and Emma Jacobs Korns, she was born Nov. 10, 1883, at Hartwick. She was graduated from Brooklyn High School with the class of 1900 and from Grinnell College in 1905 with an A.B. degree. She did additional college work at Iowa State Teachers College, the University of Iowa, the University of Colorado, and Columbia University.

Miss Korns began her teaching career at a country school northeast of Grinnell in 1905. She taught at Story City High School and Brooklyn High School before coming to Grinnell High School in 1908. She was primarily a Latin teacher, but also had taught social sciences. Miss Korns remained with the Grinnell faculty for 41 years, retiring in 1949. Her years of teaching had given her a wide acquaintance in the community, especially with her former students whom she enjoyed visiting.

She was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, a charter member of the Grinnell Chapter of the D.A.R., the Pythian Sisters, the League of Women Voters, the Grinnell Hospital Auxiliary, and the Searchlight Club. She also was a member of several professional societies, inthe Classical eluding Association of the Middle West and the American Classical League. She was a past president of the Classical Section of the Iowa State **Education Association and was** an officer and member of the Historical Literary Club. At Grinnell High School she organized the Latin Club, and under her sponsorship it grew to become one of the strongest clubs in the school.

She is survived by her two sisters, Mrs. Florence K. Manny of Toledo, Ohio, and Mrs. Jean Stickle of Des Moines, as well as a number of nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by three sisters.
