

Steve Kriegel, 45, longtime teacher and coach at Grinnell High School, died of pancreatic cancer Friday, Nov. 21, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

He was a 1970 graduate of Tama High School and competed in football, basketball, tennis and baseball. He was an All-Conference selection in tennis and an All-State selection in football, basketball and baseball.

> He earned a B.A. degree from Central College and won eight letters competing in football, basketball and baseball. He was All-Conference in football and baseball and was the baseball Most Valuable Player in 1974.

> He later received his master's degree in education administration from Northeast Missouri State University. Prior to moving to Grinnell in 1977, he served for two years as a teacher and coach at Burlington

High School.

He was married to Susan Wood Aug. 2, 1980, in Grinnell.

A head football coach for 14 years at Grinnell High School, Mr. Kriegel set a school record with his 89-51 record. While winning three South Central Conference football championships (1985, 1990 and 1991), he was honored several times by his selection as Coach of the Year. He was recently elected to the Iowa Football Coaches Hall of Fame. He had also served as an assistant football coach at Grinnell College for the past five years, during which the Pioneers have had their most successful records in several decades.

Mr. Kriegel had 200 wins as a basketball coach. His 1986 and 1991 teams were state tournament participants. He also took teams to the state tournament level in tennis and baseball. He was a coach in the
