

## William J. Kriegel

William "Bill" J. Kriegel, 78, of Brooklyn, died Friday afternoon, Aug. 9, 1996, in his home.

Funeral services for Mr. Kriegel were held at 10:30 a.m., Monday, Aug. 12, in St. Patrick's Catholic Church, Brooklyn. The Rev. John Morrissey officiated. The organist was Marilyn Kriegel and the soloist was Kevin Kriegel who sang "I Have Fought the Good Fight." Special selections were "On Eagles' Wings" and "How Great Thou Art." Flower attendants were Sarah Little and Margaret DeGeeter.

William John Kriegel, son of John and Mary Roth Kriegel, was born March 21, 1918, in Poweshiek County, Iowa. He received his education in a rural school in Madison Township. He served with the U.S. Army during World War II. He worked for Rath Packing Co. in Waterloo.

On Nov. 28, 1945, he was married to Catherine Roberta Pfiffner at Dewar, Iowa. Following their marriage they farmed at rural Deep River. After their retirement, they moved into Brooklyn.

Mr. Kriegel was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church.
