

Robert Ladd Of 1933 Lynnville Dies

Lynnville, Ia., Nov. 14, Special: Robert Pleasant Ladd, son of Robert and Ruanna T. Ladd, was born July 19, 1851, in Harrison county, Ohio, and died Nov. 6, 1933, following an illness of two weeks. He was united in marriage to Elizabeth Stephen Sept. 21, 1871. To this union five children were born, O. J. Ladd of New Sharon; Anna D., who died in infancy; Mrs. C. R. Ratcliff and Mrs. Edwin White of Newton, and Ida at home.

He moved with his family to Mahaska county in 1884 and to Lynnville in 1911, where he has since resided. He was a birthright member of the Friends church and has always been an active and faithful member and was a member of the Ministry and Oversight Body at the time of his death. He was clerk of the Lynn Grove Quarterly meeting for twenty years. He is survived by his widow and four children, eleven grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held from the Friends church Wednesday at 2 o'clock, in charge of the pastor, Rev. Giles Youngquist. Music was furnished by a mixed quartet composed of Mrs. Harvey Gause, Mrs. Charles Wagaman, Charles Potter and A. T. Gifford, accompanied by Mrs. A. T. Gifford. The quartet sang "Rock of Ages" and "There Is No Night There." Mrs. Gause sang "When I Go the Last Mile of the Way." The floral offerings were beautiful.
