**Memorial Services
For Dr. Landstrum
Held In Barnes City**

Gerald Andre Landstrum, son of August and Alberta Landstrum, was born May 28, 1895 at Kasson, Minn., and passed away at his home in Barnes City, on Mar. 10, at the age of 64 years, 9 months and 10 days, after an illness of 2 years.

As a small boy he moved to New Sharon, where he was a member of the Methodist church. He attended the New Sharon school and graduated with the class of 1914. Following graduation, he enrolled at Iowa State college at Ames, where he graduated with a degree of Veterinary Medicine. During World War I he enlisted in the United States Army.

In the early summer of 1919 he opened practice in Barnes City and continued until the time of his death, some 41 years.

On Jan. 29, 1920, he was united in marriage to Jessie June Barnes, who preceded him in death on Sept. 9, 1957. To this union was born two sons, Bill and Jerry, both of Barnes City.

During his life in Barnes City he served as mayor, councilman, and school board member for a number of years.

He is survived by his two sons, Bill and Jerry, five grandsons and a granddaughter, his mother-in-law, Mrs. Nancy Barnes of Newton, and numerous relatives and friends.

The funeral was held at the Barnes City Methodist church at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Mar. 13, and burial was in the Barnes City cemetery.
