

Landuyt Funeral Conducted Monday

Funeral services for Emil Landuyt, 83, who died last Thursday night at St. Francis hospital following several months illness, were held Monday morning at St. Patrick's church. The Rev. John T. Kennedy, pastor, officiated at the ten o'clock service.

Interment was in Calvary cemetery. Pallbearers were Morris LaKose, Lewis De Vilder, Emil Prusha, Joseph Col-lum, Amos Kilmer and August Claeys.

Emil Joseph Landuyt was born in Belgium Feb. 21, 1881. He came to the United States in 1906. He returned to Belgium in April, 1914 to marry Emerance Janssens. The couple returned here and farmed in this vicinity the rest of their lives with the exception of six years in Moline, Ill.

He is survived by three children. They are Albert Landuyt of Malcom, Oscar Landuyt of Brooklyn and Mrs. Al (Marie) Kochuyt of Chelsea. He also leaves six grandchildren.

Preceding him in death were his wife, Nov. 14, 1957, and two sisters in Belgium.
