In the spring of 1988 she completed requirements at the University of Northern Iowa, Cedar Falls, and on April 27 received permanent professional endorsements from the state of Iowa with approvals for teaching the mentally handicapped, emotionally maladjusted and mentally retarded. She also was a Sunday school teacher at Waterloo Church of Christ where she was a member.
