Friday Services At Kellogg For Milo Lemke, 64

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Friday from the Kellogg Christian church for Milo Lemke, 64, lifetime Kellogg resident who died at his home Tuesday afternoon.

Officiating at the services will be the Rev. Charles Fry. Interment will be in Our Silent City cemetery.

Mr. Lemke was born at Kellogg on Feb. 9th, 1896, the son of Henry and Minnie Lemke. On May 29th, 1919 he was married to Ethel Cooper at Newton. He was educated at Kellogg and was a member of the Kellogg Christian church and the Newton VFW. He was employed as plumber and general maintenance man at the Midwest Stamping Co. at Kellogg.

A former member of the Kellogg town council, Mr. Lemke also served in the armed forces during World War I.

Survivors include his wife, Ethel; one son, Earl of Kellogg; two sisters, Mrs. Fred Hammer of Kellogg and Mrs. Letha Simmons of Henneritta, Mo.; one brother, Forrest of Minneapolis, Minn.; and one granddaughter, Susan Lemke of Kellogg.
