H. L. Lewis.

Harmon L. Lewis was born near Cleveland, O., April 10th, 1851, and died at Grinnell, Iowa, August 24th, 1908. He was united in marriage to Mary Catharine Williams, January 27, 1876, in Rock Island county, Ill. To this union were born two sons. A F. Lewis, now living in Canada, and C. L. Lewis, living in Chester township of this county.
