Lidtka dies 1951
in Brooklyn

Lois Lidtka, 84, of Brooklyn, died Friday morning, April 10, at the Brookhaven Nursing Home there.

Funeral services for Lois Lidtka were held Monday, April 13, at 10:30 a.m. in the United Presbyterian Church in Brooklyn. The Rev. Lynn Williams officiated, and the organist was Nina Bartachek. Flower attendants were Marilyn Montgomery and Jody Rickard.

She was a member of the United Presbyterian Church, and had acted as Sunday school teacher and church treasurer. She was also a member of the Order of the Eastern Star.
