Annie Taylor Morrison, daughter of William J. Morrison (a veteran of the Civil War), and Mary J. Morrison was born on a farm not far from Slippery Rock, Pa., on April 25, 1860, Sty. Rock, Pa., on April 25, 1869. She was next to the eldest of the family of six children. Of these two brothers alone survive her; William J. who still lives on the home farm near Slippery Rock and Bertram, the prop-rictor of a shoe store in Pittsburgh, Pa. She prepared herself for the teaching profession and graduated from the State Normal school at Slippery Rock in the class or 1890, the first class to graduate from the institution. After equipments she taught in the public schools for fourin the public schools for four-teen years, nearly all of this time being a teacher in the grade schools of Allegheny, now a port of Pittsburgh. She became acquinted with her future husband, John C. Lingoln, when he was a student in the seminary in Allegheny and married him on July 26, 1904. Mr. Lincoln was at that time assistant pastor of the First Presbyterian
