

## Emma Lincoln (Alex) Rites Today

Emma Bell Lincoln, 90, of 1220 West St., the widow of Alex Lincoln, died Thursday afternoon, Oct. 3, at Grinnell General Hospital, following an extended illness.

The daughter of William and Mary Spangler, she was born Jan. 31, 1884, at Gallipolis, Ohio. At the age of 12, she came to Iowa with her parents. She was married to Alex Lincoln on March 19, 1902, at Grinnell, and continued to live in this area the remainder of her life. For 46 years she lived in the Oak Grove community.

Mrs. Lincoln was a member of the North Side Friends Church.

Survivors include two daughters, Alice and Elsie, both of Grinnell; three sisters, Cora Bailey of San Jose, Calif., Lovella Howell of Rolling Prairie, Ind., and Lillie Simonson of Rolfe; and a brother, Lester Spangler of Rolfe. She was preceded in death by her husband Alex in 1960 her son Ralph in 1973, her parents, four sisters and two brothers.

Funeral services for Mrs. Lincoln were held at 10:30 a.m. today at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home, with the Rev. Myron Harris, pastor of the North Side Friends Church, officiating.
